COOPERATIVES ALL OVER THE COUNTRY GOING EXTRA MILE TO SERVE THEIR MEMBERS AND COMMUNITIES AMIDST COVID-19 PANDEMIC: REPORTS FROM THE REGIONS - PART 3

As we continue to live and survive under Enhanced Community Quarantine because of COVID19, cooperatives nationwide also continue to respond and extend their hands to the people who need their assistance. The passion of the cooperatives to be of service to the people in the community is overwhelming. Needless to say, cooperatives had proven its worth as socio-economic enterprises in this time of crisis.

In various modes and degree of assistance, cooperatives manifested its support to help to their members and the communities. There are no micro, small, medium or large cooperatives in this time of emergencies, all are working extramile to share and serve.

In **Region 9**, the cooperatives find their ways to reach communities most vulnerable to COVID19. From disinfection to distribution of goods, these expressions of help are well

appreciated by the members and the communities.

Last March 28, Culianan National High School Consumers Cooperative in Zamboanga City, released 20 sacks of rice to its cooperative employees as support during the City





Enhancement Quarantined (COVID19) period. While the Zamboanga City Government Employees MPC (ZCGEMCO) of Zamboanga City is ready to distribute the partial delivery of 300 sacks of 5 kilos of rice to the affected people quarantined in the city. In Zamboaga Del Sur, the following cooperatives did not have a second thought of sharing what they have:

• Misalip Farmers MPC in the Province of Zamboanga del Sur distributed house to house rice and groceries to some PUMs and some identified household. A total of fifty (50) households in the Municipality of Midsalip were given assistance.

• ZDS Palm Oil Planters Producer Cooperative participated in the fight against COVID 19 by distributing 20 grocery packed which consist of 2 kilos of rice, 1 Sardine, 1 Coffee, 1/4 Sugar and 1 Face mask. The Coop Chairman Hadji Sulman U. Ubpon personally distributed the goods to individual member.

In Zamboanga del Norte Province, these cooperatives supported communities to fight the global health crisis:

 Pinan MPC delivered 970 foodpacks to 6 barangays last March 27 and additional 1,190 foodpacks on March 30 to 8 barangays. In sum, 14 barangays benefited from this valor acts of the cooperatives.

TOP Producers Cooperative, Dipolog Zamboanga del Norte, on the other hand, donated P5,000.00 worth of medical supplies to Polanco RHU frontliners.



In Dipolog City, Quantum Credit Cooperative of Dipolog City donated P 30,000.00 worth of grocery pack and rice to 35 members and 265 less fortunate members of the community.



Region 10 Cooperatives Join Government in Fight Against COVID 19 Pandemic

As the numbers of confirmed COVID 19 disease cases continue to rise in the Philippines with a number of deaths recorded, different cooperatives in our country are stepping up in finding ways of giving help not just to their members but also to our frontliners, our communities and our workers who are greatly affected by this global pandemic.

In these most trying times, several cooperatives in Region X have responded quickly to the challenges that this pandemic represents. There are cooperatives who have promptly implemented special assistance program and distributed rice packs, grocery items, multi-vitamins and allowances for their members. Whereas, some cooperatives in close coordination with their respective local government units have provided support to our health workers, community workers and our on-the-ground checkpoint police personnel by serving them ready to eat meals, bottled drinking water and vitamins. One cooperative in the region also donated decontamination sprayers and solutions to the 14 barangays of Cagayan de Oro City to help them in their fight against the spread of Covid 19.

Truly, now is the right time that we uphold and live by our cooperative values of caring for

others and social responsibility as we are facing this unprecedented time of great uncertainty. We are calling for solidarity among each of us, as a part of the cooperative movement in the Philippines that we draw strength from each other to help combat this deadly pandemic.

Among the cooperatives that responded to the call of the time are the following:

Multipurpose Cooperative (FV-FIL-VINYL • MPC) at Assumption Heights, Iligan City through the initiative of the Board of Directors gave 25 kilos of Rice to their members



- LGU Medina Officials and Employees MPC 0 Medina, Mis Oriental extended assistance to the members with groceries worth Php500 and 1/2 sack of rice
- Oro Integrated Cooperative through its CEO facilitated the distribution of knapsack sprayers in 14 Barangays in Poblacion, Cagayan de Oro City to aid them in their fight against the spread of COVID 19. 

Dear Cooperative Development Authority,

We are hoping that all is well and safe with the agency and our fellow cooperatives in the sector most especially.

We are writing to share our experience and response to the pandemic COVID19 and the related government pronouncements:

1. We consulted with our Managers and the Board regarding the conduct of our Representative Assembly on March 27, 2020 at Skydome. Given that we are expecting an attendance of 345 representatives from the various areas where we operate and 100+ employees and partner-guests, the Board has decided to avail of the regulatory relief by CDA (MC 2020-03) thus postponing the scheduled Representative Assembly. We have posted the announcement at our official facebook page and informed our members through our employees and member-Coordinators.

2. At the onset of the announcement of a Community Quarantine, we have suspended operations and advised all employees to stay at home and announced to members a moratorium on all loans beginning March 17 Tuesday until April 12, 2020. This is posted at our facebook page.

3. We continue to monitor our members and employees thru daily communications from the members to our Socio- Economic Officers and to the Managers all the way up to the Steering Committee (composed of the GM, OM, Sector Managers, and all Support Unit Heads of K-COOP). We have put into place "UA (Ulat Alas)" as a mechanism to ensure a structured and efficient line of communication.

Ulat Alas Diyes (UA10): Ang lahat ng mga SO (Socio-Economic Officers) ay mangangamusta sa kalagayan ng mga hawak na miyembro at iuulat ito sa mga Satellite Office Managers (SOM).

Ulat Alas Tres (UA3): Ang lahat ng SOM ay magbibigay ng ulat sa kaniyang Cluster Manager tungkol sa kalagayan ng mga hawak na miyembro at empleyado

Ulat Alas Kuwatro (UA4): Ang lahat ng Cluster Managers ay magbibigay ng ulat sa kanyang Sector Manager ukol sa kalagayan ng mga hawak na miyembro at empleyado

Ulat Alas Singko (UA5): Ang mga Sector Manager at Support units Manager ay magbibigay ng ulat sa Steering Committee/Office of the General Manager.

Also, our Steering Committee meet Monday- Friday at 6:00 PM via video conference using ZOOM.

4. Our employees will continue to receive their salaries according to our payroll schedule regardless of their employment status. We advised our employees to use their time wisely while on strict quarantine. Most are on a work-from-home arrangement.

5. It also helps that we continuously keep ourselves abreast with the current issuances and pronouncements by various government agencies and regulatory bodies .This enables us to take guided and appropriate course/s of action.

6. We are also reviewing our finances, preparing projections and assumptions as part of our Coop continuity and recovery plans. For sure we will have difficulty providing our members with our 2019 Interest on Share Capital and Patronage Refund.

7. K-COOP being a member also of MCPI (Microfinance Council of the Philippines Inc.) a national network of microfinance institutions is one with them in working with an industry-level proposal to seek immediate and long-term support from the government.

We do not know if all these measures in place are enough but it is working "for now".

Thus, we would like to seek your advise regarding the use of our remaining resources given this time of crisis. At the rate this is going, possible closures of small and medium cooperatives will happen. K-Coop is a young cooperative and most of our money are loaned out to our members. We are also looking into the possibility of an increase in withdrawals of their savings once we resume our operations. Our members are urban poor families and this predicament caused by COVID19 very much puts them in a vulnerable situation especially in terms of their finances. We intend to be of help but we can only do so much given our limited resources and the uncertainty of the current situation.

We would appreciate any inputs from the CDA. Moreover, we would like to know of plans for the recovery of the Cooperative sector.

Thank You and we are one with the sector in praying for everyone's safety and well-being.




VALENZUELA DEVELOPMENT COOPERATIVE COMMUNITY SERVICE IN THE MIDST OF **COVID 19**

II. PHYSICAL AREA

KNOWLEDGE is POWFR!!! Before the government declared Community Quarantine then later on Enhanced Community Quarantine, VALDECO imparts knowledge thru reading materials, posters placed in the bulletin board inside the office and FB

Post Advisory in regards to COVID 19 for members. They have a "medical doctor", member of the BOD that serves as source of information to avoid fake news or info from different sources.

Just like other coops or institution, they also did thermal scanning and disinfecting members and visitors before entering to our office.



VALDECO also follow the suggested SKELETAL WORK FORCE for the safety of employees. For those employees who are working, they were provided daily supplement of STEM CELL to boost the employees immune system.

They regularly disinfect the office and market twice a day.

III. FINANCIAL AREA

What is good in VALDECO, is that they have a regular FINANCIAL LITERACY Program for members. Some of their members and all employees and officers have EMERGENCY FUND DEPOSIT—savings product that can only be withdrawn during emergency cases. Now wherein we are in the pandemic crisis, this savings is ready to be used or withdrawn. Members who have this emergency fund feel more secure in their finances during crisis. They also offer EMERGENCY LOAN and MORATORIUM for members' loan obligation. They distributed VALDECO Market Gift Certificate worth Php250.00 for all Regular Members whether they are good standing, delinquent or in abroad as long as they have relatives leaving here in our community. They can use this GC to buy products in the VALDECO Greenleaf Market (Wet & Dry).



IV. SOCIAL SERVICES



VALDECO helped its LGU in this battle of COVID 19 by giving them financial support of Php400,000.00 and thru partnership in VALDECO Greenleaf Market "MARKET ON WHEELS" Program. Bringing goods of "palengke" in "presyong palengke" in every barangay of Valenzuela. The cooperative principle concern for the community is present not only the cooperative but also from the member-vendors joining this project. High-risk activity but very rewarding in terms of satisfaction in serving people.



UMSCPFW TOGETHER W/ CENRO PQUE AND OTHER LGU CONDUCTS PRECAUTIONARY MEASURES TO SAFEGUARD THE BULUNGAN SEAFOOD MARKET

The Unified Marketing and Services Cooperatives of Paranaque Fishermans Wharf together with CENRO Pque and the LGU conducted the flushing and disinfection of the whole area of Paranaque Fisherman's Wharf also known as "Bulungan Trading Area". CENRO PQUE headed by Sir Bernie Amurao and his team accompanied by the officers of UMSCPFW went door to door and flushed every section of Bulungan to prevent the spread of the imminent threat that is COVID-19.

Moreover, the UMSCPFW set forth guidelines/regulations in the operation of the whole Bulungan. Guidelines must be followed whether trader/vendor, consumer, or even families that live within the vicinity. These guidelines are in accordance with Proclamation #922 (Declaring a State of Public Health Emergency throughout the Philippines). As stated are the following: 1. Ugaliing maghugas lagi ng kamaygamit ang tubig at sabon, at gumamit ng mga alacohol-based sanitizers. 2. Iwasan hawakan ang mukha nang hindi naghuhugas ng kamay. 3. Iwasan ang contact sa mga hayop at mga taong may sin tomas ng sakit. 4. Gumamit ng tisyu o malinis na panyo sa tuwing babahing. 5. Uminom ng maraming tubig. 6. Kumain ng masusunstansyang pagkain at siguraduhing maayos ang pagkakaluto nito. 7. Ugaliing maglinis ng iyong pwesto/ kapaligiran ng 24-oras. 8. Iwasang maglagay ng mga kalakal (Tahong, alimasag, at anumang klase ng isda) sa lapag o sa semento. 9. Agarang kumunsulta sa pinakamalapit na health facility kung may lagnat, ubo, sipon, at iba pang sintomas ng sakit.

Thus, curfew and checkpoint are strictly implemented. According to the authorities: 1. 10 pm to 8 am (wharf is only open) 2. 8 am. to 9 pm. There should be no people in the premises (even vendors and offices) 3. STRICTLY NO FACEMASK, NO ID (umscpfw id) NO ENTRY. This is the directive that the PNP Maritime Group and the Philippine Coast Guard are trying to adhere. The directive is made plain and simple TO NEVER SPREAD COVID 19. This step proves to be vital as it suppresses the spread of COVID-19. *SKS*

A cooperative from **Region 4-A or CALABARZON,** the Gardenia Kapitbisig Multipurpose and Transport Service Cooperative, Bacoor City, Cavite, reported its assistance extended for the frontliners.

- We offered to the cooperative council of Bacoor City our drivers and vehicles to ferry medicines, donations, packed foods for the front liners and for whatever said vehicles may serve;
- 2. Said vehicles are on stand by and ready for use at any time requested by the city;
- 3. Our members helped in packing relief goods for the community; and
- We distributed free purified drinking water to the law enforcers manning the barangay checkpoints.





The Spirit of Cooperativism was felt as the cooperatives of **MIMAROPA Region or Region 4-B** deliver efforts of helping their members, community and frontliners amidst the COVID19.

The management team of Palawan State University Multi-Purpose Cooperative (PSU MPC) led by Manager Noel Callorina , reached out to the unsung heroes, the front liners, both members and non-members of the cooperative.

Cooperatives became partners of government institutions and other stakeholders in extending community services under its Community Development Program. They allot 3% of their



annual net surplus for projects and activities that will benefit the community where they operate. They may be small or big cooperatives, but they religiously shared their meager earnings every year for their Community Development Fund (CDF) as mandated by law.


