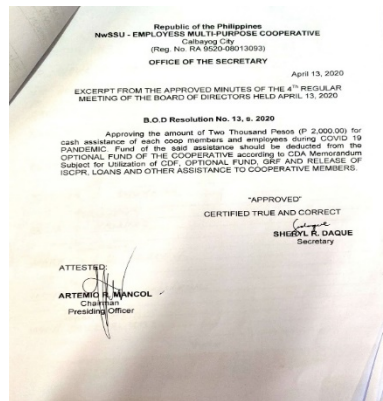

The country has been in a State of Public Health Emergency for more than a month now due to COVID-19. In some areas, turmoil is slowly brewing since a lot of people are not able to work due to the imposed community quarantine and they have no means of providing for their families.

In Region 8, members of cooperatives are coping, as well as their communities and frontliners, as they are being provided with assistance by cooperatives.

- Caibiran Cabucgayan Culaba Transport Cooperative (C3TRANSCO) Transport Service plying daily within the Province of Biliran, 13 of 26 PUV units take turns in every other day trips
- Tamadotco Transport Cooperative, Land Transportation Service: 10 units plying daily from Marasbaras to DownTown and vice versa, 2 Units from Abucay Terminal to DownTown Tacloban and vice versa
- Northwest Samar State University Employees Multipurpose Cooperative (NwSSU-EMC) shared Php50,000 for frontlines relief operations and gave a total of Php261,000 to members and employees;
- Isabel Bay Multipurpose Cooperative (IBMPC) provided 5 kgs of premium rice to each of the 251 contractual workers.
- Samahang Pangkabuhayan Nang Riverside, SAPARI Multipurpose Cooperative gave assistance in kind to frontliners using its CDF.
- Nagkakaisang Magsasaka ng Caibiran Multipurpose Cooperative (NAMACA-MPC) provided relief operations to 120 members using its CDF.





- SNPOSA Multipurpose Cooperative (SNPOSA MPC) participated as KADIWA Purchasing Farmers Produce
- Nagkakaisang Magsasaka ng Caibiran Multipurpose Cooperative (NAMACA-MPC) participated in the Kadiwa Center of DA
- Provincial Government of Biliran Employees Multipurpose Cooperative (PGBEMCO) participated as KADIWA Baksan Organizer



- Saint Bernard Multipurpose Cooperative (SBMPC) provided daily food assistance to the frontliners, donated Php60,000 to 155 students stranded in Cebu City, provided rice to SBMPC members and calamity assistance to staff and officers. Total amount charged to CDF: Php730,000.

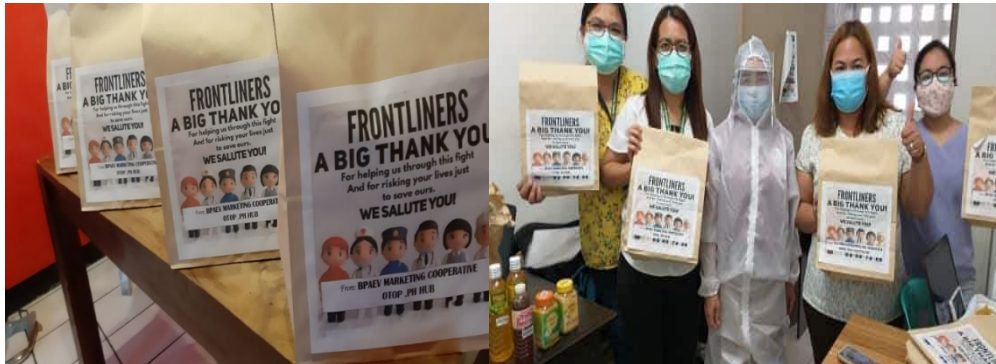
- Southern Leyte Employees Multi-purpose Cooperative (SLEMCOOP) donated one (1) unit of mechanical ventilator to help COVID19 patients. On-going distribution of 10 kilos rice to as much as 12,543 members. CDF was utilized for the above activities.
- Pinoy Credit Cooperative provided cash assistance of Php300 per member.
- Southern Leyte State University Credit Cooperative (SLSU-CC) provided PPEs to hospital frontliners.
- Tomas Oppus Multi-Purpose Cooperative (TOMPCO) released in advance Interest on SC and Patronage Refund.
- Bontoc Multipurpose Cooperative (BCCI) released in advance Interest on SC and Patronage Refund and butchered hogs and distributed to members for free, rather than selling it. It also offered backyard farming with free starter kit (seeds and technical assistance).
- LIDE Employees Multipurpose Cooperative (LEDEVCO) gave rice to members totaling Php44,500.00 and hygiene kit to employees worth Php17,390.00.
- Perpetual Help Multipurpose Cooperative (PHCCI-MPC Tacloban) donated PPEs to 3rd Beneficiary, the Eastern Visayas Regional Medical Center (EVRMC); Php 200,000.00 total for three beneficiaries, charged against the Optional Fund and Php215,000.00 for the community charged against the Community Dev't. Fund
