

SUCCESS STORY ON “KOOP KAPATID PROGRAM” AND RELATED PROGRAMS

PRELIMINARY STATEMENT

As early as 1990, the PLDT Employees Multi-Purpose Cooperative or TELESCOOP was one among several cooperatives that pioneered the concept of and implemented the “*Big Brother-Small Brother Program*” in terms of assistance in the organization and training requirements of “*small cooperatives*” in Metro Manila. It continuously implements its own “*Big Brother – Small Brother Program*” for the benefit of small and start-up cooperatives up to the present and extends its coverage nationwide pursuant to the distribution and location of TELESCOOP Members.

When CDA launched the “*Adopt an Indigenous People’s Family Program*” in 2018 as part of Cooperative Social Responsibility and the “*KOOP KAPATID Big Brother and Small Brother) PROGRAM*” in 2019 by way of application of the internationally accepted 6th Cooperative Principle on “*Cooperation Among Cooperatives*”, TELESCOOP was one of the principal supporters of the twin CDA Programs.

Always a “*helping hand for the needy*”, the assistance provided by TELESCOOP in the form of technical, financial and logistics may be considered as success factor for the beneficiaries who are small and struggling cooperatives because they have been resuscitated from their near-death status or predicament. More than anything else, TELESCOOP strives to contribute to the upliftment of the living standards of the Members of these small cooperatives so that they would not become a public burden of the Government.

SUCCESS STORIES OF THE BENEFICIARIES OF THE CDA “KOOP KAPATID PROGRAM” AND RELATED PROGRAMS

As part of its own program and in partnership with CDA-NCRO, the PLDT Employees Multi-Purpose Cooperative (TELESCOOP), its Officers, Members, Employees and Stakeholders are gratified and humbled by the success factor and benefits generated by the unselfish support and assistance it has given to these small cooperatives.

The small cooperatives which were supported by TELESCOOP and logically benefited from the “*KOOP KAPATID PROGRAM*” and related programs are the following:

I. IBA AGRARIAN REFORM BENEFICIARIES ASSOCIATION MULTI-PURPOSE COOPERATIVE (IARBA-MPC) in Iba, Cabanglasan, Bukidnon

- b. Its members are agrarian reform beneficiaries, elderly and indigenous people numbering 44.
- c. Its principal business before was lease of tractor and mechanical corn dryer.
- d. It has an Asset of ₱ 7,365,298.00 as of December 31, 2018.

2. Assistance Provided by TELESCOOP

TELESCOOP donated a total financial assistance of ₱ 900,000.00. The first ₱ 500,000.00 was deposited/ provided in December, 2020 for the establishment of a Grocery Store and Provision of Farm Inputs.

As of February 15, 2021, a Liquidation Statements was submitted by IARBA-MPC certifying the actual establishment and operation of a Grocery Store and details of expenses totaling ₱ 486,024.50.

On this basis, TELESCOOP deposited the 2nd tranche of ₱ 400,000.00 on April 27, 2021 for the cost of electrification for the mechanical corn dryer.

The Officers, Members and Employees of IARBA-MPC committed to put into productive use the funds provided by TELESCOOP for the benefit of its General Membership.

II. BARANGAY RIZAL COOPERATIVE at Block 59, Lot 20, Ubas St., Zone I, Barangay Rizal, Makati City

- b. It is composed of 87 Community based Members (36-M & 51 F).
- c. It is involved in urban agriculture, War on Waste and Laundry Business
- d. It has an Asset of ₱ 807,369.00 as of December 31, 2018.

2. Assistance Provided by TELESCOOP

TELESCOOP donated a Total Financial Assistance of ₱ 100,000.00 for the purchase of mixer machine, raw materials and liquid soap for its Laundry Business.

3. Initiatives of Barangay Rizal Cooperative

The Officers, Members and Employees of Barangay Rizal Cooperative committed to put into productive use the funds provided by TELESCOOP for the benefit of its General Membership.

During this abnormal situation, a Revolving Fund of ₱15,000.00 was set-up for the needed supplies for the dishwashing business and the rest of the donated funds were deposited in the Bank for future use. When everything normalizes, it intends to push through with its Tents, Chairs and Tables for Rent Business.

III. KOOPERATIBA NG MGA TINDERA SA NORTH HARBOR at Pier12, North Harbor, Tondo, Manila

- a. It was registered on August 9, 2010 under CDA Certificate of Registration No. 9520-16015956
- b. Most of its 20 Members are women and former stall or carenderia operators in North Harbor.

- c. Its principal business is in the operation and management of Canteen at North Harbor.
- d. It has an Asset of ₱ 1,510,719.34 as of December 31, 2019.

2. Assistance Provided by TELESCOOP

TELESCOOP is readying and will soon turn-over the donation of one (1) Brand new Desktop Computer, One Brand New Printer and ₱ 20,000.00 for the purchase of filing cabinet, working table and installation of Cooperative signages.

3. Initiatives of Kooperatiba Ng Mga Tindera sa North Harbor

The Officers Members and Employees of Kooperatiba ng mga Tindera sa North Harbor committed to put into productive use the donation and logistics provided by TELESCOOP.

As part of its income generating activity, the Printer shall be used internally and externally for photocopying business for a fee.

TELESCOOP donated two (2) Brand New Desktop Computers, One (1) Brand New Printer and One (1) 3-Door Filing Cabinet.

3. Initiatives of Sts. Peter & Paul Parish (Makati) Multi-Purpose Cooperative

The Officers, Members and Employees of Sts. Peter & Paul Cooperative committed to put productive use the donation and logistics provided by TELESCOOP.

Among others, they would now concentrate on the reconstitution of the subsidiary accounts/ledgers of their Individual Borrowers and other related records and initiate collection of overdue accounts from delinquent Members.

SUCCESS STORY OF THE BENEFICIARY OF TELESKOOP “BIG BROTHER – SMALL BROTHER PROGRAM”

As part of its own program, TELESKOOP provided technical, financial, logistics and related assistance to the following Cooperatives:

I. SAN VICENTE SUR FARMERS AGRICULTURE COOPERATIVE in San Vicente Sur, Iriga City, Camarines Sur

TELESKOOP provided the necessary technical, financial, logistics and training requirements that paved the way for the CDA registration of “*San Vicente Sur Farmers Agriculture Cooperative*” as a full-pledge Cooperative with CDA Registration No. 9520-105000000035732 in 2017.

In 2018, it received a grant or donation of three (3) Irrigation Pumps from the Department of Agriculture – Pili where TELESKOOP shouldered the cost of installation of one (1) irrigation pump which is now in operation and being used by the farmer beneficiaries.

In December 2020, after three (3) typhoons wrought havoc in the Bicol Region, TELESKOOP donated ₱ 173,000.00 for the 56 Members affected by the three (3) typhoons for purposes of clean-up, re-planting as part of environment protection and Covid 19 assistance.

On two (2) occasions the latest of which was on December 30, 2020, TELESKOOP received Citation or Certificate of Thanks and Gratitude which were jointly issued by Officers of San Vicente Sur Farmers Agriculture Cooperative and Barangay Council of San Vicente Sur, Iriga City, Camarines Sur for the most appreciated and unwavering assistance from TELESKOOP.

II. COMMUNITY BROADBAND WORKERS COOPERATIVE
