## **PMES: Perceived Benefits Among Members of tubungan Teachers' Multi-Purpose Cooperative**

### **Objectives**

To determine the perceived level of benefits derived by members of Tubungan Multi-Purpose Cooperative from pre-membership education seminar (PMES) when they were taken as a whole or classified according to gender, age and civil status.

# Highlights

Results revealed that the members of the cooperative perceived a very high level of benefit from PMES whether they were taken as a whole or classified according to categories except for the widowed members who only felt a high level of benefits. There was no significant difference in the perceived benefits on PMES among members when classified according to gender, age, and civil status.

## Recommendation

1. The cooperative, through its education committee and officers, should in still to the prospective members that PMES is a great help to develop their skills and for them to be aware of their rights and responsibilities.
2. The members should undergo through education and training seminar to know more about the operations and the services rendered by the cooperative.
3. The future researchers should conduct studies on the benefits derived by members on trainings, seminars, and similar activities of cooperatives.



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
